



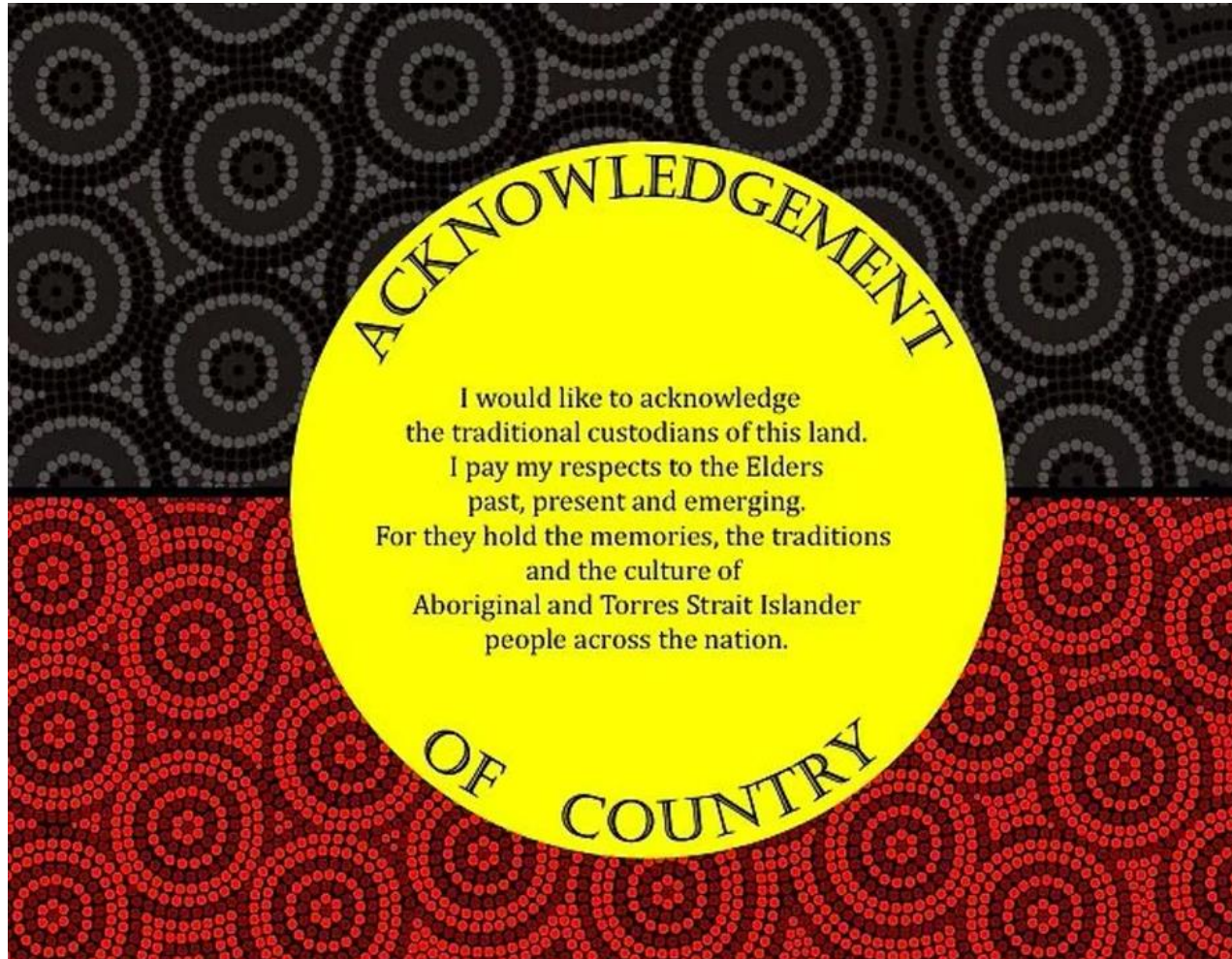

Why does a school community need a P&C Association?

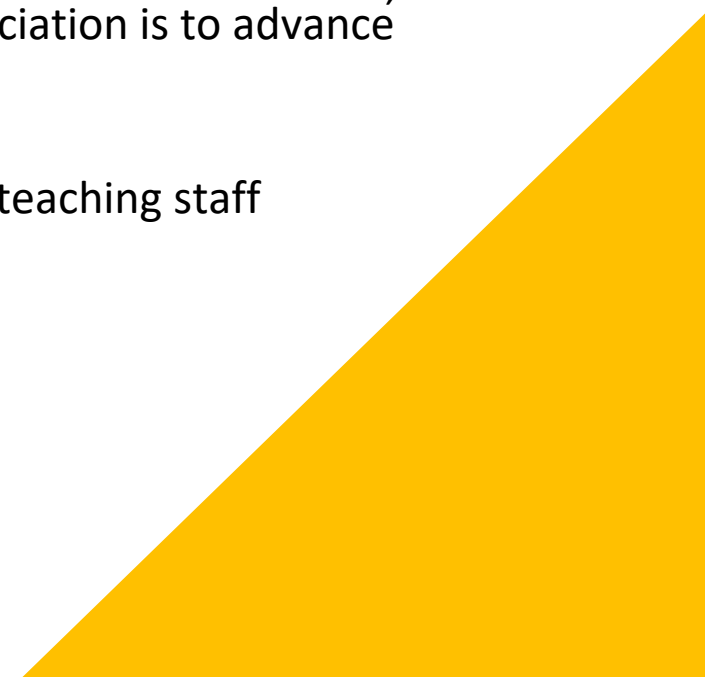
A P&C Association enables parents and citizens to meet to determine the needs and aspirations of the school community.

What does a P&C Association do?

The objectives of your P&C Association focus on the improvement and provision of services to others, particularly children in public school communities. One of the aims of a P&C Association is to advance education.

The objects of a P&C Association are to:

- promote the interests of the school by bringing parents, citizens, pupils and teaching staff
- into close co-operation;
- assist in providing equipment required by the school;
- report to the Minister the material requirements of the school;
- assist the teaching staff in establishment of school policy and management in all facets of school activity.

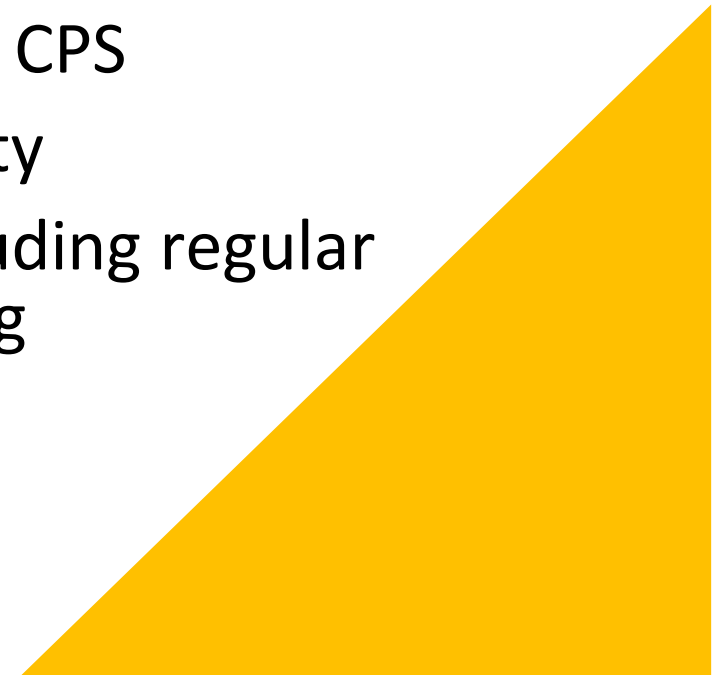
About CPS P&C

Continuous improvement (processes, PR)



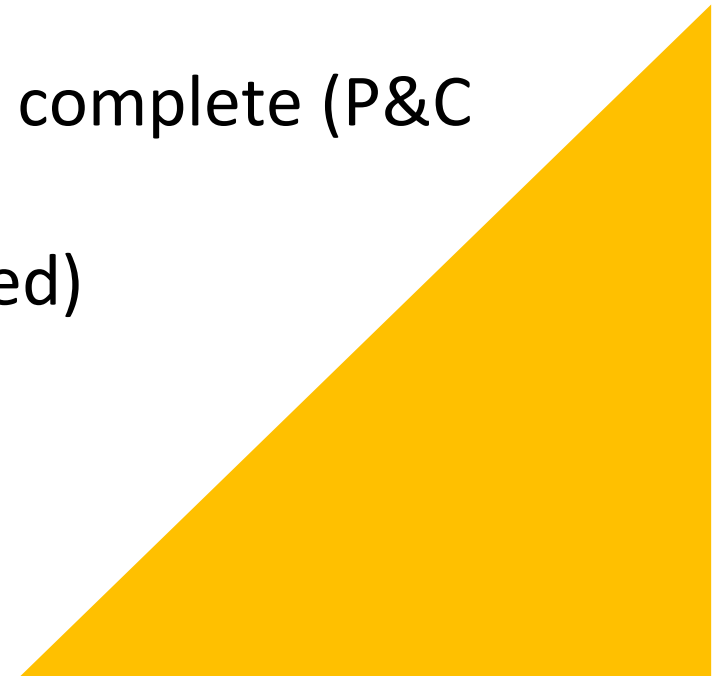
General introductions - attendees

2. Environment (Sense of Place & Belonging)

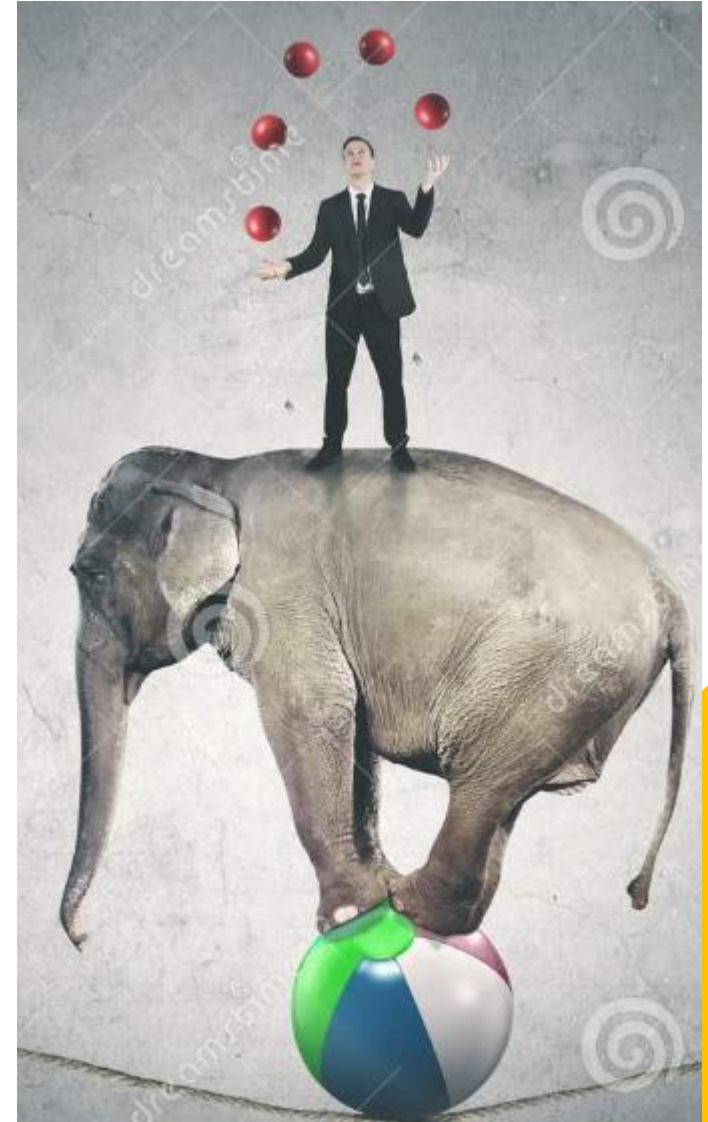
How: E&S Sub-committee, School grounds/infrastructure improvements, classrooms/learning resources, art

Measure of success: Playground built (timing AMU-dependent)





3 Pillars for 2023:

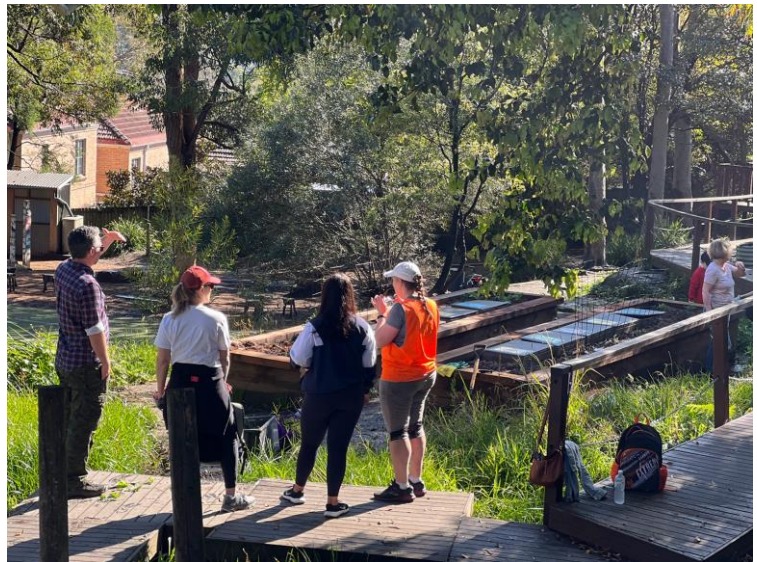
1. Develop sustainable practices and processes at CPS

1. Band Numbers - 2023

- The CPS band program has had a great start to the year, with five bands formed and in rehearsal
- Band participant numbers for 2023 are as follows: Concert Band – 61; Big Band – 16; Intermediate Band – 46; Stage Band – 21 and Junior Band 55
